COVID WTO Initiatives

- Sectoral elimination of tariffs and NTBs on essential medical supplies and basic hygiene products;
- Measures to ensure that supply chains are resilient even in times of crisis;
- Remove barriers to the movement of essential personnel in times of crisis;
- Shore up trade in food and agriculture, by removing export restrictions, eliminating NTBs, strengthening value chains and enhancing transparency

Current WTO challenges

- MC12 delayed to mid-2021
- Distraction of Director-General race
- Appellate Body paralysis continues
- Challenging progress on negotiating areas
 - "Unfinished business" from Doha Round
 - E-commerce
- Other reforms discussions ongoing



WTO Ministerial ("MC12")

- Transparency, monitoring
- Doha unfinished business
 - Agriculture domestic support
 - Fish subsidies
 - Services domestic regulation
- E-commerce negotiations
- Other issues
 - Inefficient fossil fuel subsidies
 - Greater inclusion in trade
