CTI Dialogue 2: Possible ABAC approach



- Propose focusing on the "bottom up" approach
 - Dynamic and incremental achievement of concrete deliverables, within the framework of an overarching vision and work plan

Part 1: Recall regional initiatives that have used this model of economic integration, for example:

- Aus-NZ Closer Economic Relations (1983) → Single Economic Market
- ASEAN Free Trade Area (1992) ---> ASEAN Economic Community

Case study: Australia-NZ Single Economic Market



Signing of CER, March 1983



SEM talks, February 2024



- Specific initiatives have led to deep and broad economic integration
- Original vision: Closer Economic Relations in 1983
 - CER started with duty-free **goods trade**, based on agreed **ROO**
 - Services added in 1989, progressively liberalised through to 2014
 - Joint Food Standards system 1995
 - Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Arrangement (occupational registration and goods standards) 1996
 - Progressive business law harmonisation (e.g. company accounting standards, consumer protection, patents, business regulation, mutual recognition of business registration) 1990s to 2000s
- 2009 onwards: the Single Economic Market Agenda
 - Focus on "3rd generation issues" e.g. Investment Protocol (2011), mutual recognition of trade facilitation tools (2016), e-invoicing (2018), digital identities (ongoing), and many more.

Enabled a unique trade negotiation: CER + ASEAN = AANZFTA (2010)



Part 2: Examples of specific ABAC building blocks

Specific "early harvest" initiatives for 2024:

- Women's Access to Venture Capital
- A New Services Agenda
- A Greener Trade Framework
- Coherent Digital Trade Provisions
- Resilient Supply Chains

Contribution to APA – examples:

- A New Services Agenda to replace ASCR, supporting APA Collective Actions on trade, structural reform, digitalization
- *A Greener Trade Framework* to contribute to APA Collective Actions on sustainability
